## Hot Rod Power Tour 2024 — How Many Cars, and You Drove A WHAT??!!

efore I begin—our next event is 12 Oct. We will meet at the Alamance Battleground at noon. We will have a picnic (everyone bring their own picnic lunch) followed by our meeting and then a tour of the battlefield. After the tour we will head out to

the Homeland Creamery in Julian NC. Please drive your old cars if you are able and if not that's 110% OK, everyone is always welcome. If it is raining, we will meet at the covered picnic area at the Scout Hut, same time (noon), eat, then have our meeting. We will still go to Homeland Creamery after the meeting for those who want to.

Hot Rod Power Tour 2024—WOW! Another car adventure in early June with an estimated 7000 cars, yes that is the correct number 7000! The 30th Anniversary of HRPT kicked off 10 June at Beech Bend Raceway Park, Bowling Green KY. I hit the road in a 2023 Challenger and arrived at the hotel Sunday 9 June. The hotel was right across the street from the National Corvette Museum and yes, I should've gone. Anyway, as usual on the tour there was a car show in my hotel and every hotel in the area! Monday morning it was off to Beach Bend Raceway Park; what a great facility! The bleachers around the drag strip were covered so how great was that, Jerry, Judy and I enjoyed the racing in actual shade! At this venue there was drag racing and autocross and a huge number of cars! Lucky Costa from Hot Rod Garage was there and off course I got his autograph! That night I met up with Jerry and Judy for dinner then we watched the burn out contest going on in their hotel parking lot. After I got back to my place the burn out contest continued until 1:00 AM (sleeping was optional that night!).

The next morning it was off to Nashville Superspeedway. Though it wasn't very far away, the route that we followed was scenic and I enjoyed the drive. At Nashville there was autocross and of course, the cars. Derrick Berri from Vice Grip Garage was there, another super guy. He was very humbled by the turn out for him and very appreciative.

Next up, L&N Federal Credit Union Stadium in Louisville KY; home of the Louisville Cardinals. The drive there was amazing! The Tennessee and Kentucky small towns and backroads, people waving and holding up signs welcoming us was incredible...you had to be there. I see why Jeannie loves KY so much! The route took us right by Churchill Downs which was really cool. At the stadium the cars were the stars—no driving activities just a humongous cruise in!

The ride to Hebron, OH and National Trail was great, but it had some interstate. Drag racing was the deal so I looked at the cars both on and off the track—there were so many cars!

The last destination was Lucas Oil Indianapolis Raceway Park, home to the NHRA Nationals. This drive was way more interstate than I liked but it went smoothly. On the way I stopped at the National Museum of the United State Air Force. If you have never been there and you like aviation, it is a most see. I went there because one of the HH-3E Jolly Green Giant helicopters I had flown was in there plus the B-24 Liberator that is in the museum was part of heraldry of one of the squadrons I commanded. The 512th Bomb Squadron was the predecessor of my unit, the 512th Special Operations Squadron. The squadron patch on the B-24 was the same as my unit's patch! The other reason was the museum accepted one of the helmets and H-3 checklists I used while flying the HH-3E, into their collection—what an honor! I rushed through the museum (I came back the next morning) and to IRP. At the last destination most folks just go in and leave. I sat and watched the drag racing participants for a while then then headed back to spend the night at Wright Patterson AFB. The next morning, I spent some time in the museum then headed home. The ride home was uneventful so after about 8 hours I pulled into the driveway - 2300 plus miles after I departed the previous Sunday.

There may be those there who wonder why in the world would you drive so far to get to the starting point (over 520 miles), drive 3-4 hours a day for five days and then drive over 600 miles back. Is it the cars? Well, the cars are fantastic and you see everything from pure stock to wild customs, muscle cars, mini-vans, trucks, station wagons and everything in you might think of and some you would never think of! Well, that's great but it is the people you meet that make the tour. My first two nights my hotel neighbors were from Canada, throughout the week I met folks from near to way way far! There are no strangers on the Power Tour, only new friends plus having Jerry and Judy on the tour really made it special. The other thing I really like is no one judges what you drive on the tour. Yes, a very few moan and groan there aren't enough old cars, but most of those old cars are hot rods, modifieds, restomods, street rods, whatever. It just really doesn't matter. What matters is you are with folks who share the same passion you do and that is downright wonderful!
