#### Minutes of the April Meeting

he Alamance Chapter, AACA, met on April 14, 2018. Tal Johnson called the meeting to order. He thanked the hosts - Barbara and Herb Klutz and Ray Fowler. Chip King was welcomed back. He then asked for a motion to approve the minutes as printed in the newsletter. John Cox made the motion to accept and it was seconded by Pat Tulauskas. The motion was approved. Jeannie Johnson gave a Treasurers' report and said that we now have \$7,300 in sponsor money for our show with 9 of those also being Web Sponsors. The deadline is Monday, April 16. She said that we currently have 14 pre-registered cars. We need to encourage everyone to pre-register and they don't have to pay until the day of the show. This helps to get most of the paperwork completed prior to the day of the show. Jeannie said that donations have been made of \$1,000.00 to ACC for our automotive scholarship. Memorial donations have been made in memory of Linda Burns' father and Elizabeth Coble's father and mother. She noted that John Elder has rejoined the club and that Ed Burns has an email address change. There is also a stack of registration forms at the clubhouse so if anyone is going to a car show or a cruise in, please come by and take some with you to distribute. Pat Tulauskas made a motion to accept the Treasurers Report and it was seconded by John Cox and was approved.

Tal reminded everyone to please send your pictures and articles of your cars to Bruce Anliker for the newsletter. He reminded us that the Oakland-Pontiac group will be in Burlington on April 20-22. Friday night there will be a meet and greet at the Best Western from 5:00 to 7:00 pm with the group eating at Grill 584 afterward and we are invited to join them. On Saturday they will tour to Saxapahaw and then on to Pittsboro. The NC Region is using this as their April outing and Cruise in. The group has cancelled going to the Downtown Burlington Depot on Sunday. Bill Cox commented that the NC Region group has 30-40 cars for their Cruise Ins. They will be meeting in the parking area behind the S & T Soda Shop and will be having Ice Cream in the upstairs area. After lunch and ice cream their group will be going to Silk Hope for a farm tour.

On May 5, Henry Gaither has planned a tour at the Alamance County Battleground with the group meeting there at 11:00 am. Please be sure to bring a picnic lunch. The group will then do the "Dave Rich Honorary Ice Cream Tour" by going to Julian to the Homeland Creamery.

Our Car Show is on May 19 and registration is available on line. The Hospice Car Show is scheduled for September 29 and will be in the Dillard's parking lot the same as last year. Tal said that the NC Region editor sent our registration for our car show to all the President's of the chapters. Tal will also be emailing to the 100 - 150 people that he has emails for as a reminder. He and Jeannie will be at the Dogwood Festival in Mebane on April 28 and they will distribute flyers there. The Cruise In that was previously at Northern Tool has been moved to Holly Hill Mall and will be on the 4th Saturday each month. Ed Burns said that he will hand out flyers there. Tal has put the show on the Carolina Cruisers web site and it is being announce on WBAG radio. The Alamance News and Mebane papers have been contacted

about coming out and taking pictures. We will have our normal ad in the Burlington Times-News. Bruce is working on the posters, Dash plaques and Trophies. He is working closely with the trophy people on the proper orientation of the pictures that are on them. We have 5 fire extinguishers to sell and it was felt that that was enough. Judging may be an issue as Rick Holmes may have to be out of the country at show time. If anyone is really computer savvy then we could use your help, if not then we can do the manual way.

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
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
