Minutes of the September 2018 Meeting

he Alamance Region, AACA met on September 8, 2018. There were 23 members present. Tal Johnson called the meeting to order and thanked our hosts - Catherine and Henry Gaither and July and John Cox. He then asked for an approval of the minutes as published in the newsletter. Henry Gaither made a motion to approve and Richard Holmes seconded. The minutes were approved. Jeannie Johnson wasn't present but Tal gave a brief Treasurer's report. He said that the Property Tax has been paid and Post Office Box rental. He said that the club has received a Thank You card from Bill Webster's family for the donation to Hospice in his memory.

Tal moved on to the upcoming Hospice Show on September 29. We will need everyone to brings canned drinks to sell and Bake Sale items. Peter from Hospice is to pick up the Tents, Tables and Chairs from TCS. TCS will deliver the Port-a-Potties. Herb Klutz, Henry Gaither and O.T. Smith will go to WBAG at 10:00 am on Friday, September 28 to talk about the Show. Our flyers and information are listed on Carolina Crusin', Craig's List, Cox Toyota's Electronic Sign on the Interstate and the Mebane newspaper, Alamance News and Times News are saying they will cover the show as well as the Times News is donating a free ad thanks to Becky Pickett. Tal has sent out emails to all those that have been collected over several car shows. So far only 3-4 have signed up. We will also be in competition with Faith United Methodist Church Car show on that day. Herb Klutz reported that there will be no more Cruise-Ins at Holly Hill Mall - this may have to do with liability insurance. Hospice has the insurance for our show but everyone has to sign a release when they come to registration. The auction of the Pontiac Sign still needs an auctioneer. We still have about 400 flyers and several posters. Please take posters and put them up around the area. New lids for the donation buckets have been acquired and the holes are in the tops. Trophies have been ordered. We will plan to use caution tape and saw horses to mark off the parking lot. For those who are on the list to help with transporting items form the club house to the parking area, please plan to meet at the clubhouse on Friday at 4 pm in order to start set-up by 5 pm. Let Jeannie Johnson know if you aren't assigned to a duty for the meet and she will add you. Bob King said that they need another truck on Friday since John Cox won't be here and Billy Mebane volunteered. Bob also asked if anyone has a 10 x 10 pop up tent, we need a couple more. commented that the University Drive Chick-fil-A is closed for remodeling. We buy the sandwiches for \$3.20 and can sell them for \$4.00 per our contract with them. Tal reminded everyone that we always need articles for the Newsletter and that next month we will be picking the cars to be featured for our 2019 car show. Tal and Jeannie have been working on the place to feature on the advertising and he said that the Alamance County Historical Museum is so grown up that it would be hard to get a picture to put the cars in front of. They contacted Preservation NC and were told that to use the picture of the Teague House would cost \$100.00 as it is a copyrighted picture and then was told that we wouldn't be able to put cars in from of it. Diane Eckland and Jennifer Viza are currently living in the house. Tal asked for someone to go talk to them. Richard said he will go and maybe Dave Rich can go with him to take the picture.

November will be the election of officers and you need to contact John Cox if you want to participate.

Herb and Barbara Klutz talked about their Montana Vacation. Poor Herb had to ride in a Chevrolet. He said they drove 2,000 miles and the check engine light came on. 

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
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
