

The Glencoe Mill Textile Heritage Museum Anniversary Celebration

ur Alamance Region AACA Club was invited to display at the anniversary of the Glencoe Mill Textile Heritage Museum on Saturday March 30th. There were five vehicles from the club present; Melody Brevda's 1926 Cadillac, Ray Fowler's 1938 Buick, Larry and Elizabeth Coble's 1956 Ford F100, Herb and Barbara Klutts' 1956 Ford Thunderbird and my 1966 Corvette.

What promised to be a beautiful Spring Saturday started off with sprinkles around Burlington. So much for all that car clean up Friday afternoon! The weather did not stop us though, and eventually provided its beauty by mid morning. It turned out to be a perfect day as the sun never got too hot and the temperatures were perfect all afternoon. We parked our cars in front of the museum and greeted guests of the museum who were there to soak in the history of the Mill Village. The cars were a bonus to everyone who stopped by as many shared their stories of cars they had owned in their past.

The Glencoe Mill was built in the late 1800's and operated as a mill up to the 1950's. It produced plaid flannel cloth at the time when there were many mills throughout central North Carolina, some of which were owned by the Holt family, original developers of the Glencoe Mill. The area was named an historic district for Alamance County in 1999 and is currently a National Historic District. The current district

has been a cooperative effort between Preservation North Carolina, Alamance County and the city of Burlington. The mill village was purchased by PNC through a generous gift from Ms Sarah Rhyne a local citizen.

On Saturday, the museum provided an open house of the premises and several demonstrations of the work done at the mill over many years. The museum building houses the original administrative offices and company shop from the time it was a working operation. We enjoyed a lunch in the event hall from the Chopping Block Restaurant and then an anniversary cake was provided at 2 in the afternoon. We displayed until late in the afternoon and then took a nice ride home... I was fortunate enough to have a nice ride back to Hillsborough with the top down!

Many of us discussed the idea of a club outing to the mill sometime in the near future. It's an easy ride out highway 62 north of Burlington, just across the mighty Haw River. I look forward to a return to the mill!


