

Car of the Month January 2023: The Gaither's 1966 Mustang 2+2



It all began either 19 or 20 April 1966 at Metuchen New Jersey... the day VIN Number 6T09C247192 was born...an Ivey Green 1966 Ford Mustang 2+2. The car was equipment with black standard interior, 289 2-barrel V8, C-4 automatic transmission, radio, deluxe seatbelts with a seat belt warning light, knock-off style wheel covers and lower panel molding. The car stickered from Ford for around \$3100.00, which in today's dollar is \$28,500.00. The car was shipped to Friendly Ford in Greensboro NC and on 19 December 1966 was purchased by Raymond Gibson, Jr.

For the Gibson's the Mustang was a family car. I talked to Raymond's widow and children and they went everywhere in the car. Raymond and my dad worked together and one day in November 1972 he asked my dad if he would be interested in buying the car for \$550.00. My dad came home and asked me if I was interested and reminded me, I had to pay for it. At that time, I was on my second car, a 1964 Ford Falcon with a six cylinder. Now my dad was asking if I wanted a Mustang with a V-8...the answer was YES! So, the Falcon went away and the odyssey with the Green Car began!

When we got the car, it had a dent in the driver's side fender so my dad knew a body man who could fix it and paint the whole car to match. I scrapped the money together and the car came back looking great! Shortly thereafter I was in a fender bender so the car was fixed and painted again. The bad thing was the body man worked outside and after he painted the car it rained...the car looked like it was a miniature moonscape with little craters in the finish. So, the car went back and was completely sanded and repainted. Once again, the car looked great!

Being a teenage hot rod wannabe, I saved my money for mag wheels and white letter tires. I wanted that dragster look so shackles were installed in the back until I could afford air shocks. We also installed a JC Whitney dual exhaust with glass packs and the car was right! The car rumbled into Smith High School until I graduated in 1974. During that time there were lots of cruising down High Point Road and stories which do not need to be printed.

After high school, I headed to The Citadel but as a freshman no cars were allowed so the car sat unless I was home on leave until

my sophomore year. 1974 was a banner year for me because I graduated high school, started college, and went out with my future wife to church on Thanksgiving Sunday. From then on we dated in the car and had numerous "adventures." During that time my best friend Scott and I went to Davidson's in Greensboro. On the way out I backed into a large pot hole and it punctured both glass packs...the car sounded even better! However, this now announced my arrival and departure from Catherine's house so her dad new exactly when I left! The neighborhood also knew whenever we had a, well, "disagreement" by the sounds of a snarling Mustang heading home. Eventually I did get new glass packs...

I kept the car until I graduated in 1978 and went into the Air Force. My dad said I needed a better car than an old Mustang so I made the huge mistake of buying a 1978 Toyota Corolla Liftback (zero personality but good gas mileage). My parents sold the Mustang in late 1978. I was gone so I'm not sure of the date. The car went to a dealer who kept the car on an open title until he sold the car to John Hamm of Henderson NC on 18 September 1986.

For many years I regretted selling the car because we had so many fun times with it. I was home on leave in 1987 when I found the 1974 registration from the car. I called the NC DMV and asked them if I could find out where the car was located. They asked if I had the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) which I did. They told me where the car was located and the owner (don't even try this today). I called Mr. Hamm and in 1988 new adventure began...

I called Mr. Hamm and asked about the car and if I could come see it. He said that would be fine but he really wasn't interested in selling. I went to Henderson and there she was... The mag wheels and loud pipes were replaced by Mustang wire wheel hubcaps and a single factory correct exhaust. Mr. Hamm had kept the car in great shape and even showed the car. I looked the car over and the emergency brake handle was still red where I painted the letters "FORD." For years after that initial visit, I would come home and go see the car. Whenever I asked about selling, he would throw this huge unreasonable (at that time) number. Catherine even went with me a time or two. Every time I saw the car the memories would flood back. In 2004 I retired from the Air

Force and we settled in Burlington. In late October of that year, I went to see the car. It was obvious it wasn't driven very much anymore and as I talked to Mr. Hamm, I told him if he was ever interested in selling to please call me. This time, Mr. Hamm said I might be surprised. Very shortly after that visit I received a call from his wife and son, telling me he would be calling and since he did not drive the car very much, he as interested now in the money it would bring. In early November, 2004, I got the call I was hoping for...he was ready to sell the car if I still wanted it.

On 15 November 2004, a new adventure began as the car came home! The dual exhaust came back but not so loud, factory style-steel wheels replaced the hubcaps, and a four-barrel intake replaced the factory two-barrel. We still take the car on adventures but mostly me since the smell of no catalytic converters is strong for compared to today's cars. All of my grandchildren have had photos taken at the wheel of the Mustang

as soon as they were able to grab it. Today a new rebuilt engine (yes still a period correct 289) and four-speed transmission are waiting to replace the original engine and automatic. These will be kept and stored safely away to go with the car if it is ever sold which begs the question will the car ever be sold? That is a question I honestly cannot answer and the reason is simple, you never know what is around the next bend that contains circumstances you never thought would or could happen. But for now, the adventures with the Green Car will continue. I hope to have the car ready for the Hot Rod Power Tour this summer and maybe Run to the Sun Car Show in Myrtle Beach this coming March...I would never want the car to be a trailer queen it is too much fun to drive! Regardless, we will still be making memories!






