The Purchell's Graham Hollywood

ne of my project cars is a 1941 Graham Hollywood. We go to a lot of estate sales and auctions looking for silver plate flatware to use in our jewelry making hobby. One day last October, I found a listing for an estate sale Clemmons North Carolina and what caught my eye was not the silverplate, but a car that I hadn't seen before.

I grew up in the 50's and 60's in a small New York tourist town. My family owned several service stations at different times and pumping gas was the job for me. Every summer the tourists would come to town to visit the Fort or play on the lakes. I saw just about every kind of car or truck there was. I guess that's why I don't really have a favorite car. I have lots of favorites and Graham is one I've never seen. I spent a lot of time on the internet learning what I could about Grahams in general and The Hollywood model in particular.

I learned about the long road to Hollywood, then on to Madison Square Garden. Here is the story as I understand it.

Before entering the automobile business, Joseph, Robert, and Ray Graham operated a successful glass business. They later sold the glass company to the Owens Glass Company and entered the auto industry. Their entry was not what you would expect though. They developed kits and parts to change Ford Model T's into trucks because at that time Ford did not make trucks. They later built their own trucks using mostly Dodge Brothers engines.

In 1925 Dodge Brothers purchased the Graham truck company and the brothers went looking for a new venture. They found it in the Paige motor car company, and it became Graham-Paige. The Graham -Paige limped along through the great depression as did most all business.

In 1936 the Cord company produced the first 810/812 models known as the coffin nose Cord due to the design of the hood and front facia of the car. It was front wheel drive and was 30 years or so ahead of its time. Unfortunately, the 810 came too late and the company went bankrupt. As part of the bankruptcy, the dies to make the bodies for the 810/812 were sold to the Hupmobile company.

Unfortunately, Hupmobile wasn't in the greatest financial shape either and needed a partner to be able to produce cars from the dies. This is where the Graham brothers come in. Hupmobile and Graham-Paige agreed that Graham would

make the bodies and as payment would be able to market their own model as the Hollywood and Hupmobile would sell a model called the Skylark.

These cars are pretty much identical to the Cord 810/812 from the windshield back but entirely new in front due to the Cord being front wheel drive and the Hollywood/Skylarks being conventional rear wheel drive.

Shortly after the agreement was made, less than 400 Skylarks were manufactured, Hupmobile failed and closed its doors. During the 1940 and 41 model years only a couple of thousand Hollywoods would be produced and of that it is estimated that 350 are titled as 1941.

The Graham brothers continued through the war producing war materials for the war effort. After the war, Graham-Paige car company was sold to Kaiser and continued making cars for a time under the Kaiser-Fraiser name. The brothers next began manufacturing appliances and dabbling in Real Estate, eventually owning Madison Square Garden until 1962.

Well, back to our Graham-when I saw it in the estate sale listing, I thought that it would be a great original restored car. Unfortunately, the reality of the car when we saw it set in. It had been extensively changed from front to back, the suspension had been changed from Graham to AMC Pacer, the driveline was now a Ford 302, AOD, and differential, not the original Graham supercharged 6 and standard transmission. The interior had also been altered with a modern front seat that I think was a 90's Taurus. The gauges were all modern aftermarket and there was no electrical wiring in the car.

It was even titled as a North Carolina specially constructed vehicle as it was missing its original V.I.N. tag. When I inquired as to why, I was told that when the owner moved here from Oregon, he couldn't find the title or the VIN tag to get a North Carolina title. The car was destined to be a restomod.

The car is now in a shop to complete the modifications and for a bit of good news, we found the VIN tags. After talking to the original owner who is 92, he said look behind the passenger front seat.

The VIN tag is riveted to the floorboard under the carpet. That was a new one for me and with a little luck we will be able to get the VIN on the title restored.

Kluttz awarded Silver Antelope honor


