David Ballard with Timeless Cruisers spoke about their show which will be May 13 and he asked that anyone from our club that could help with judging to let him know.

Tal asked the club if we wanted to have a July meeting as previously it had been mentioned not meeting. Rick Holmes made a motion that we have the meeting and it was seconded by Lynn Pickett. The motion was approved.

Tal sent the host list around as hosts are still needed for some months.

Tal asked for a motion to approve the minutes as published in the newsletter. Henry Gaither made the motion to approve and Rich Holmes seconded and the minutes were approved as published.

Jeannie Johnson gave the treasurer's report and noted that Floyd Smith had gotten 14 sponsors out of the 22 that we had already. Bill Cox made the motion to accept and Henry Gaither seconded and this was approved.

Bill Cox asked if we could send out the membership roster by e-mail and Jeannie said that she would send. Tal asked about the newsletters and registration being on-line and Ed is continuing to work on this. Ed said that he had been in touch with the Webmaster at National for help.

Tal told the group that Mebane is struggling to get help with the Dogwood Festival car show and that they need judges. For this show, they award trophies based on Top 10, Best of Show, Best Chevy, Best Ford, Best Chrysler and Best Foreign Car. The show is April 22.

John Cox reported about the National Business Meeting that he attended. He and Judy attended several seminars-The History of the Auto, Collector Cars (Titles), Estate Planning, Repair and Restoration, and there was the Humorous History of Autos. At the member meeting, there was continuing concerns about the museum. He said that a couple of clubs didn't think that National was working hard enough. National has every conversation and memo documented. The museum wants half of everything that we raise plus \$300,000 per year paid to them. There are still legal issues concerning the logo and their being able to call it the AACA Museum. They don't have an elected board of directors. Judy thanked the club for sending them. The emphasis of the meeting was to get younger people involved in the hobby and all clubs are struggling with older populations.

Lynn Pickett said that the Alamance Civitan Club will be selling bales of pine needles for \$5.00 per bale next Saturday. They will deliver within 10 miles of their facility with a minimum purchase of 10 bales.

The program was a White Elephant Bingo Game that works similarly to Dirty Santa.

The meeting was adjourned by Tal.

AACA National Show in Ocala, Florida

arry and I went to the National Car Show in Ocala, Florida in February. We left on Wednesday, February 22, to break up the drive down. I-95 was a mess and we would come to complete stops at several different places across South Carolina and into Georgia due to road work and repair on bridges. When we got to the Georgia line we decided to spend the night at Exit 3 because it had started to pour down rain. Getting the 24 foot car trailer and truck into motel parking lots is always a challenge but we found a motel with an attached steakhouse restaurant and that had room for the trailer.

The next morning we were back

on our way and it was a beautiful day. We wound our way across upper Florida and went down some smaller roads which was enjoyable. Check in was at the National Parts Depot in Ocala and from there were given directions to trailer parking at the Mall which is directly across from the College of Florida where the show was being held. One of them had stopped by and talked with me about our truck during the show. The company I work for, Glen Raven, Inc., has a small location in Cumming and I have been there before so it was easy to talk to the guys next to us. It also turned out that across the table there was a guy that lives in Cumming who is a retired Eastern Airlines Pilot. Small World! We received our Preservation Award.






