Tal's Corvette

f you remember Tal having surgery a few years ago, you know that he had a little difficulty with it and it really curtailed his activity for a good long time. So long in fact that his 1964 Corvette sat in the garage for a long time. Being a Corvette aficionado, I was always thinking about that Corvette that I had last seen about 4 years ago at one of our Region car shows in Burlington.

Occasionally I would ask Jeannie about it and she would tell me it's still sitting in the garage and Tal had not been able to touch it. He was having enough trouble getting back to walking good, much less getting into a small two seat sports car! As I thought about it, I knew that leaving this car sitting for a long period of time would be trouble and if it went too long, it could have some serious problems that would be costly to repair.

So, last month at one of our board meetings, I asked Jeannie if Tal would like for some of the guys in the club to come over one Saturday and have a little work session and get the car started again. It was well received and we arranged it for one Saturday in late March. I called a few guys that I knew were close by and I figured had some car-starting knowledge. There was Bob King and I because we have Corvettes, John Cox, because he has significant experience being stuck on the side of the road, and then there was Herb Klutz, because we needed a serious mechanic that the rest of us could watch.

We started off with a tour of the garage and all the cool stuff Tal and Jeannie have collected over the years. Then we got down to some serious work. It seems Tal and Jeannie's son had already spent significant time replacing the battery which is in a really tight spot on Tal's car. So we replaced the old gas and gave the engine a start. With a little coaxing and starting fluid she cranked up. We didn't run it long though as the carburetor began to flood the engine intake. This happens when a car sits without running and the working parts inside the carburetor gum up over time

The only thing to really cure the problem is to remove the carburetor, tear it down and clean it, and then replace those inner parts with a new kit. Of course,



Herb jumped right in, took the carburetor off and took it with him to perform the rebuild at his shop at home. The rest of us had to sit down after a tough day of watching Herb work and have a cold drink!

After a sufficient rest, we were invited inside to a fabulous lunch and some lively discussion about cars, people and the state of the world today. It was so pleasant that I suggested we do this same sort of thing



more often, even if we have to make up some sort of problem with a member's car. We just let you know we're coming to fix something and all you have to do is throw a party!

We had a great time visiting with Tal and Jeannie, and in a few days, Herb finished rebuilding the carburetor and put it back on Tal's car. It's back running again and Tal can move along with whatever else he needs to do to keep it maintained. This was a great club activity and we all had a great time... of course you gotta ask Herb his opinion... he did all the work!




