Therefore, the May car show would be for cars 25 years or older and we would need to note on this requirement on the car show flyer. Billy asked for a motion and Rick Holmes made the motion and then John Cox seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the change passed for the car show.

There were a few other items mentioned concerning the car show and flyer:

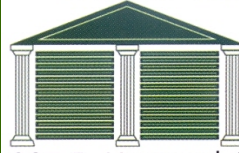

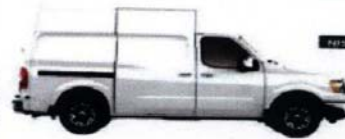
