Minutes of the October 2018 Meeting

he Alamance Region met on October 6, 2018. Tal Johnson, President, called the meeting to order. He thanked our hosts Bruce and Bobbie Anliker and Billy Mebane. Tal asked for a motion to approve the minutes as published in

the newsletter. Rick Holmes made the motion and it was seconded by Herb Kluttz. The motion was approved.

Jeannie Johnson gave the Treasurers Report. She reported that the Hospice Show raised over \$10,000.00. She also reported that we have new members - the Purchells - and that they will be back for the February meeting. Ray Fowler made a motion to approve the Treasurers Report and Herb Kluttz seconded. The report was approved. Jeannie said that Freddy's is still planning to donate a portion of their sales for that day. She also said that all the money that the Timeless Cruiser's gave was in memory of Mr. Shankell and most of it was from businesses. The Mebane Enterprise posted pictures from the show that Bill Cox sent and an article. The Times-News gave us a 1/4 page ad for free. Cox Toyota also let us have space on their electronic board at the Interstate.

The other Hospice Fundraiser - The Festival at the Farm has been rescheduled until some time in November due to rain and muddy conditions. They are still talking about when the tickets for the raffle car will be drawn. Eric Marsh, NC Region, appraised the car for \$8,000.00. Ronnie Kirkpatrick was the person who donated the car. Tal said that we need to work with Faith UMC next year so we don't schedule our Hospice Show on the same day. The Festival at the Farm is supposed to be the first weekend in October next year. Jeannie also suggested that our club have a Facebook Account which is free.

The Dave Rich Ice Cream Tour will be on October 20 to Pittsboro. Also the NC Region Fall Meet is that day in Spencer. Tal reminded everyone that November is our Annual Business Meeting and we will be voting on cars for the dash plagues, officers and the budget for 2019. Everyone needs to try to attend this meeting. Bruce said that he will be able place the featured cars in front of the house and correct any flaws from the photo. Tal shared that Dwight Murray is wanting to sell Jim Murray's 1957 Ford T-Bird. Jim was a founding member of our Region. Flyers were passed around with the information.

We were reminded that anyone wanting run for an office for next year should contact John Cox. A motion to adjourn was made by Rick Homes and seconded by Jeannie Johnson.
