Minutes of the November 2018 Meeting

 he Alamance Region held the annual business meeting on November 10, 2018. There were 21 members and no visitors present. Elizabeth Coble, Secretary, in the absence of President Tal Johnson and Vice President Henry Gaither,

Jr., called the meeting to order. She asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the October meeting as printed in The Weak Spark. John Cox moved that they be accepted as printed. Jeannie Johnson seconded the motion and it carried. Jeannie Johnson, Treasurer, passed out copies of the proposed budget for 2019. Barbara Kluttz made a motion that the budget be approved. Rick Holmes seconded the motion and it passed.

Elizabeth reported that John Elder donated \$150 to our club to be used as needed. The Board recommended that a Benevolence Fund be established with that money to be used for memorials for members or their families or for flowers for members who are ill. The recommendation was approved.

Bruce Anliker noted the high costs associated with printing the newsletter and requested that anyone who could receive it by email to please do so. The Coble and the Kluttz families removed their names from the mailing list.

Elizabeth noted that the NC Region annual meeting will be held in Raleigh this year. Our club has donated \$200 in past years to help defray the cost of the meeting and to have our car show flyer printed in a second edition of the NC Region newsletter. The members present were in favor of continuing that donation.

The Host List was passed around for everyone to sign up for 2019. Bobbie Anliker reported that a mouse had eaten a hole in the vacuum cleaner bag and dust blew out the hole when she tried to vacuum after the last meeting. Jeannie and Tal Johnson have donated a vacuum cleaner to the club.

A list was passed around for members to sign up to attend the December Christmas party. This year there will be a white elephant event. Each member is to bring a wrapped gift – anything you would like to bring. Also, it was requested that each family bring a dessert to be added to the desserts that will be provided by the caterer.

Elizabeth showed a picture taken by Bill Cox of the Teague/ Holt house in Graham. Richard Holmes suggested in a prior meeting that we use this house on our car show dash plaques. Bruce Anliker said that he believes he can use that photograph and put the 2 cars selected into the picture.

A ballot with the names of members never having a car selected for a dash plaque was passed out. The list was reviewed and those members not having an eligible car were deleted. It was discussed having only one car on the dash plaque since we are running out of eligible members with cars. It was decided that next year we would open up the list to all cars instead of members not having been honored before as some members have multiple cars. Bill and Linda Cox and Alan and Kathy were selected to have their cars honored at our 2019 spring car show. John Cox reported that the Christmas party will be held at 6 pm on December 8 at the Lake Mackintosh Clubhouse. We will meet to put up tables and chairs and decorate on the Saturday, December 7 at 10 am. There will be entertainment at the party which will include some of our members.

Elizabeth reported that Bill Cox needs 4 more convertibles for VIPs to ride in at the Hillsborough Christmas parade on December 2 at 3 pm. John Cox said he could use his son's convertible and he is to let Bill Cox know.

Elizabeth announced that Bill Cox is looking for muscle cars to be on display in Spencer at the Transportation Museum for a 3 month period. Anyone who has a car that could be used should contact Bill Cox. Herb Kluttz announced that The Village of Brookwood is sponsoring a car display tomorrow from 2-4. If anyone can attend, just show up there.
