Rick Holmes is planning to attend the North Carolina Region Annual Winter Meeting in Raleigh on January 18th and will carry a quantity of our May 16th Car Show brochures to be distributed to the attendees.

John Cox attended a Burlington City Council meeting the past month to get the required authorizations for the May 16th downtown car show. In view of last year's limited available parking space for show cars, John requested an additional parking area and received permission to use it

Many of you did not know my Mom was a serious "Car Person." She was not like that all the time but when my Dad bought their 1990 7-Up Mustang at the 30th Anniversary of the Mustang in 1999, she became totally immersed in the car...like seriously immersed. I think it really began when Mom and Dad took the car to their first Mustang Show and they won...it was there she was bitten by the car show bug! Because the car was totally stock (they took off the original tires (but kept them) because they were so hard the ride shook your teeth out!), they showed it in that class. They bought the car from the original owner who happened to work at a Ford dealership. That owner kept every piece of paper associated with the car...build sheets, dealer order form, truck bill of lading form, new car sticker, Mustang 1990 brochure, key tags...you name it and they had that documentation. The other paperwork they had was the dealership's newspaper setup sheet for an ad promoting the 7-Up cars...an ad that never ran because the 7-Up promotion was cancelled.

Mom and Dad took the car to numerous Mustang Club of America National and Grand National shows from Florida to Massachusetts and won at every show they entered. Mom and Dad took these shows and the competitions very seriously and each had defined jobs. Dad's job was the exterior and engine compartment while Mom had the interior. She had some special little brushes to get into every nook and cranny and you did not bother her when she was doing her job! After everything was beyond perfect, Mom of course became the car's social coordinator for the weekend. She made sure no one was left out of the conversation no matter where they were...the show field, in the hotel, or the awards banquet/ceremony.

Mom and Dad earned enough points to be awarded the Conservator Award from Mustang Club of America. Part of that award was a numbered grill emblem and a special place on the show field whenever they entered a MCA show. To say Mom and Dad were proud of that award is an understatement. It was the culmination of a lot of hard work and just like they were everywhere in life, a true team. I'm sure the car would have qualified for AACA's HPOF category had they shown it in an AACA national show.
