


President's Message

Minutes of the March 2020 Meeting

he Alamance Region met March 14, 2020 at the clubhouse for its regular monthly meeting. Twenty-seven members and no guests attended. The meeting date occurred early in the global Coronavirus period when many gatherings were being discouraged and likely affected attendance. The meeting was conducted by President Elizabeth Coble.

Elizabeth and Larry recently returned from the AACA Winter Meeting at Philadelphia where the first "Pinewood Derby" for small model car racers was held. Our Alamance member Rick Holmes' uniquely designed and constructed red miniature racer won every heat it raced in against approximately 30 competitors and won the race. Rick was awarded lifetime AACA membership for his winning racer. The Pinewood Derby was very popular and is expected to become a favorite event in annual winter meetings.

Some of our newer Alamance club members haven't had their cars photographed to display on the clubhouse walls. A date will be scheduled this spring for Bill Cox to make pictures of those members with their cars.

The club voted to order new red monogramed T-shirts with our club logo, hopefully to be available for the May 16th car show. Samples are being ordered. A list was circulated for each person to choose their size, and will pay the approximately \$15 cost of the shirt.

We have 1500 flyers printed to be distributed for the May 16th car show. Trophies for the show usually come from China, and may not be available due to the effect of the Coronavirus on Chinese products.

Sponsors for the show must be identified by mid-April in order to receive advertising credit in the various media publicizing the show. Floyd Smith recommended that sponsors be told the car show could be rescheduled but would not be canceled.

Faye Boswell with the local Hospice organization contacted Floyd regarding a Hospice fundraiser event that will be held at Bob Keen's Alamance County Ranch May 2.

There was a lengthy discussion on how to arrange and park the wide assortment of cars at the car show. It was decided this year to park cars at random, without regard to any grouping as in past shows.

Henry Gaither is planning an ice cream outing/drive for the club on Saturday May 2nd.

Club treasurer Jeannie briefly discussed our finances, and that we are \$764 behind budget so far this year.

It was announced the March 28th scheduled visit to the Alamance Community College Automotive Technology Department has been postponed due to the effect of the Coronavirus on the facility's schedules.

A new date to clean and repair the clubhouse and outbuildings will be Saturday May 23rd, one week after the car show.

Lynn Pickett announced that a club he belongs to is having a \$5 per bale pine needle sale March 21 and 28.

While walking the show field at Hershey in October 2019, one vehicle caught my eye not only due to its rarity, but also due to the unique auto accessory. The car was a 1913 Rolls-Royce Silver Ghost owned by Robert Barrett of Angola, New York. Cream yellow, bright brasswork, and beautifully restored, it was definitely hard to miss. But what really caught my attention was the strange looking contraption attached to the driver's side of the car. There was what appeared to be part of a pipe organ mounted to the running board and connected to the exhaust pipe. and a small set of keys or paddles mounted just behind the driver's door. Strings connected the keys to the pipe assembly. The owner was nearby, explaining the device to a small group of onlookers. It was a Gabriel 10-note Exhaust Organ, made by the Gabriel Horn Manufacturing Co. that was based in Cleveland, Ohio. The keys were connected

by the strings to valves on the organ pipes. When a key was pressed, the valve would open, and exhaust gas would sound the pipe.

Mr Barrett said that he has had the exhaust horn since the mid 1970's, and he has parts of another one that is not functional. After repairing this horn, he attached it to the exhaust side of his Electrolux vacuum cleaner to learn to play it. A search on Youtube will yield a video of him playing the exhaust organ at a car show. It is quite a nice sound, and much more pleasing than the exhaust whistles I have seen. So I wonder if operating this system while driving would be considered "distracted driving"?
