April 17, 2021 Secretary's Minutes

he April meeting of the Alamance Region AACA was held at the Scout Hut behind Shiloh Presbyterian Church on Grand Oaks Blvd. at noon on April 17, 2021. There were 34 members and 8 guests present. Following a hotdog lunch, President Elizabeth Coble called the meeting to order. She recognized Floyd Smith on his 90th birthday and Herb Kluttz on his 82nd birthday today. She thanked Herb for securing the Scout Hut for the meeting, getting the chips, providing the grill and cooking the hotdogs. She noted that the meal was purchased at Steve's Garden Market, one of our car show sponsors. She thanked the members for bringing desserts.

Elizabeth reported that Richard and Judy Holmes received the Senior National Award for their Model A Truck and the Cobles received the DPC Certified designation for their 1986 Ford Pickup at the AACA Southeastern Spring Nationals on April 9-10, 2021, in Charlotte.

Our 49th annual car show is now scheduled for August 28, 2021, in downtown Burlington at the Depot. The location is subject to change since it is not certain that the city will be allowed to have events of that size because of the pandemic. Elizabeth urged members to start getting sponsors for our show. She reported that the dash plaques and trophies will not have a date on them in the unlikely event that our show will have to be cancelled for this year. Floyd Smith suggested that Lambs Chapel in Burlington might be a possible alternative location for our car show. Mike Blalock is a member of that church and will investigate that possibility.

Rick Holmes reported that he has updated our website and the registration form for the show is now on it. He urged everyone to register for the show since that makes our day of show registration run much faster. Pre-registration costs \$15 and day of show registration is \$25. If you pre-register, you do not have to pay until the day of the show. He also reported that there is a new section on the website for members only and members will need a password to go to that site. Elizabeth recognized the visitors present: Mark and Tori Terry (who joined our club following the meeting), Mickey and Jason Kluttz (Herb and Barbara's son and grandson), Donnie Nance, Kevin Hill (Coble's son-in-law), Charlotte Rogers (Floyd and Elsie Smith's daughter) and former member, Pat Tulauskas. She reported that we have new members, Christopher and Leanna Snell. Christopher is Earl Ewing's grandson and the owner of Earl's Ford Ranchero pictured on our clubhouse wall.

Jeannie Johnson, treasurer, said she had sponsor forms available and urged members to start selling sponsorships. Sponsors are essential for the operation of our club. Rick Holmes asked the members to let the sponsors know about the possible change of location for the show. In the event that the show must be cancelled, the sponsors will get a refund.

Henry Gaither announced the Great American Iron Poker Run to be held on May 15. The starting place with be at 1 pm at Dunham Sporting Goods parking lot where each car will receive a playing card. From there each car will visit 4 American made car dealerships to pick up a card and finish the run at Homeland Creamery in Julian. There you can keep the poker hand you have or trade some or all of your cards for another hand. The best poker hand wins \$50.

Elizabeth reported that there will be a car show for the benefit of Living Free Ministries on May 1 at Holly Hill Mall. The entry fee is \$20 per car. The judging will be from 11 am – 12 pm and awards will be presented at 2 pm. The NC Region Spring Meet will be in New Bern on May 8. On June 5 there is the 2021 Outdoor Fair on the Field at the Hawfields Community Park at the ball fields, 2115 NC Hwy 119S in Mebane. The fair runs from 8 am to 2 pm and is hosted by the Hawfields Civitan Club.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

And what is was, was a Mustang?!

ormally on Sundays I get the Mustang out for a drive. Usually I head out to some random country roads and enjoy the sights for a while then it's off to the local Ford dealerships. Well a couple of weeks ago I pulled into Stearns Ford and there it was... a 2021 Mustang Mach E.

Well I'd read about the Mach E so I drove the 66 over to take a closer look. I put the cars side by side and begin my check out. Well, the original Mustang was designed with young buyers in mind...a reasonable price (around \$2500.00 depending upon how it was

equipped) long hood, short deck lid, "sports car" shape, sporty interior, decent power for the day (V-8) and a long option list.

Well, the Mach E has short hood and a lift back. The interior was modern Mustang for the most part but the dash is a computer screen, no real gauges (the car was turned off).

The price starts at around \$43000...that's \$5,250 1966 dollars (FYI a 66 GT 350 cost \$4,428.00 in 66 dollars and \$36,270 in 2021 dollars...good luck finding a 2021 GT-500 for that price!!!). The Mach E does have two doors not including the hatch and the rear lights are "traditional" Mustang tribars. I'm thinking younger buyers will love it because it is a rolling computer with zero emissions.

How about go power? Does the Mach E have the zip to earn the Mustang name? Well, in 1966 a GT-350 with 306 horsepower had a 0-60 time of 6.6 seconds and it ran the quarter mile in 15.2 seconds at 117 MPH. Not the blistering speed but OK for the time (I found another source that said 14.0/92 MPH).

So does the new-fangled Mach E compete...let's see 480 HP with up to 634 pounds of torque...0-60 3.5 seconds (GT version), quarter mile 12.2 in the neighborhood of 118 MPH (GT Performance package). FYI the fastest first generation factory Mustang was a 1969 Mach 1 with a 428 Cobra Jet... 0-60 5.5 seconds/13.9seconds @103 MPH in the quarter mile. Yep I'd say the Mach E was pretty fast.

But is it really a Mustang...yes and no. The Mach E is a definite departure from a two door coupe or convertible. For me it looks like a EV (Electric Vehicle) SUV and I

personally have a hard time with that. However, I think the days are numbered for "traditional" coupes and convertibles powered by internal combustion engines and that number is shrinking fast and it is time accept that fact. With ever increasing stringent emissions rules car companies are moving toward electric power (full EV or hybrid) in all their vehicles.

I think the Mustang Mach E is the face of the future of the Mustang, again like it or not. I only hope that there will still be the traditional Mustang coupe and convertible though powered by something else...hey if it has the same or better horsepower and torque of the Mach E I'm for that! If you don't like it then keep driving you gas powered old or new Mustang!

So, after all this discussion what did my 66 Mustang and the Mustang Mach E have in common? Both have a Mustang in the front, in the back, and inside, two doors and not much else. So do I like that it's called a Mustang? Well....hmmm.


